## **PENTNEY PETITION TO THE PRIME MINISTER** West Norfolk village takes its appeal to Downing Street.

The residents of the rural west Norfolk village, Pentney are appealing for supporters to sign their online petition asking the Prime Minister to spare their historic village, and have it removed from the current list of proposed sand and gravel quarry sites.

The MIN93 site is one of many listed in the recent Minerals Site Allocation document, published by Norfolk County Council, and villagers are concerned because the proposed site wraps around the village and encroaches right into the heart of it, threatening several historic and listed buildings.

Sam Knox, manager of the Save Pentney website set up the petition on the governments own 10 Downing Street website, and hopes to collect at least a thousand signatures before the petition closes in a years time.

“We appeal to everyone who feels strongly about this to take a moment to sign our petition, and ask your friends and family to do likewise.” said Sam.

“The more signatures we can collect, the more chance we have of ensuring our voice gets heard by those in power.”.

The petition can be found online at <http://petitions.pm.gov.uk/Save-Pentney>, and the sign up process couldn't be simpler. You enter your details, and the website sends you a confirmation email containing a link. Simply click on that link and your name is added to the petition.

The website, [www.SavePentney.co.uk](http://www.SavePentney.co.uk) was set up by local resident Sam Knox to give the people of Pentney village a single unified voice with which to make their opinions and feelings about the MIN93 quarry proposal heard by a worldwide audience. The site features an uncensored public forum where comments and opinions are invited from supporters and opposition alike.
